


VOICES FOR THE FUTURE

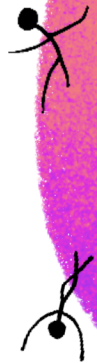

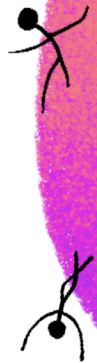

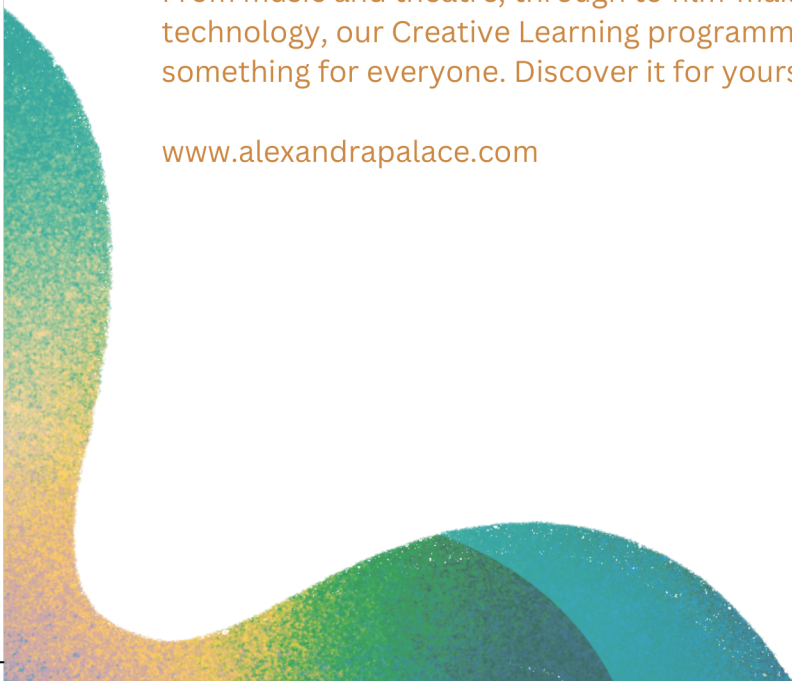
